



## Andrew Ernest Breuer

October 27, 1931 - August 28, 2014

Andrew Ernest Breuer, 82, passed away August 28, 2014 at Butterfield Trail Village in Fayetteville after a long battle with leukemia.

He was born October 27, 1931 in Sperry, Iowa, the son of David F.H. and Martha Ludemann Breuer. Northwest Arkansas has been his residence since 1980. He was a Certified Public Accountant and a graduate of the University of Iowa. Memberships included the American Institute of Certified Public Accounts, The Iowa Society of CPAs and the National Association of Accountants. He was a member of the Springdale First United Methodist Church and the Springdale Kiwanis Club. He served in the U. S. Army from 1953-55.
