Athadean Self Weir, 85, passed away Monday, April 30, 2012 at the Earlene Howard Hospice House in Springdale. She was born November 20, 1926 in Waldron, Arkansas. She was the daughter of Roy Dennis Self, Sr. and Sadie Marie Kopf Self. She was preceded in death by her parents, two sisters, Robbie Marie Self, Eva Leta Self Thomas; one brother, R.D. Self, Jr.

Growing up during the Great Depression left a mark on her character that lasted her entire life. She could never bring herself to waste anything and could find a use for most everything including bread bags. They were married October 12, 1949 at the First Baptist Church in Waldron.

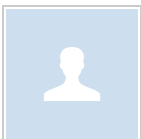
