She was so much fun and so full of advise. She used to dance around when she was cutting tomatoes or lettuce, which earned her the nick name "Betty Boop". She was always at work, never sick, and never missed a day. She loved to walk to work and back home on beautiful days. She would take off walking with her purse and just swing it back in forth. When I started driving, I would take her home just a couple miles down the road and she used to "act" like she was scared and say don't go until I fasten my seatbelt crazy girl and she would hold on to the door, and then she would just laugh. She told me many times that she loved working and having fun with me and she always gave me a hug every single time I saw her. She came to my wedding and she saw my children when they were born. She always rode the bus to Wal-Mart and a couple of times I saw her sitting on the bench waiting for the bus to go home and I would get on to her for not calling me to take her wherever she needed to go, then I would load her up and drive her home which, again she acted like she was scared to death of my driving. I was an experienced driver then too(in my 30's) with 3 kids. Oh such Good Times we had! When my son turned 16 the high school was out of parking permits so she let him park at her house, which was right by the school, and she would have him cookies baked when he got out of school. Almost every time I went to her house she was baking cookies or pies. I haven't seen her since she sold her house, but I sure do miss driving by there and seeing her looking out the front door, in the backyard hanging up her clothes on the line, or working in the yard. I would stop at the light and roll down my window and would holler at her and she always waved big at me and would holler she loved me and for me to come see her sometime. She used to tell me the school district was not getting her house until she couldn't live by herself anymore so they just needed to leave her alone and that when she was ready to sell her home she knew where to call.
