Carol Colley Moritz Brown, age 81, of Springdale, Arkansas passed away peacefully at her home on December 18, 2025.

Carol was born January 3, 1944 in Gadsden, Alabama to Clarence and Margaret Moritz. She graduated from Lamar University in 1965 with a Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry. Throughout her career, she worked as a chemist for Shell Oil, served as an administrative assistant for Forest Park Canning Company, and later worked as the state registrar for the Arkansas State Soccer Association.
