Charles E. Coward, 90, of Springdale, passed away March 12, 2011 at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. He was born October 12, 1920 in Tuttle, Oklahoma to Edward R. and Bessie Crouch Coward.

Charles was an employee in Sales of Yeager Wholesale Company of Tulsa for twenty one years and retired in 1985 from West Ark Electric after 10 years.
