Dale D. Clark, 74, of Springdale died Jan. 5, 2009, at Northwest Medical Center-Springdale. He was born Dec. 6, 1934, in Boxley to James Fred and Kate Bell Edgmon Clark.

He was a member of Wesley United Methodist Church in Springdale. He was a U.S. Army veteran serving during the Cuban Crisis. He was director of Fayetteville Boy's & Girl's Club and Parks and Recreation for 34 years. He was a governor's appointment to Parks and Trails Committee. He competed in the Senior Volleyball Olympics. He also enjoyed working his farm and with his cattle.
