



## Don Sigmon

January 10, 1969 - July 11, 2024

Don Sigmon, 55, passed away peacefully in his sleep July 11th 2024 at his home in Kodiak, Alaska in bed beside his loving wife, Sharon, of 28 years. He was a caring husband and beloved father, son, brother, and grandfather.

Don was born in Springdale, Arkansas January 10th, 1969 to Dan Sigmon and Joan McGarrah.
