Earl Dewayne Dove, born July 28, 1945 in Springfield, Missouri, to Rev. Leonard D. and Elsie Dove died February 23, 2008 at his home near Gentry.

Earl was preceded in death by his father, Reverend Leonard D. Dove, an infant brother Ray Lynn Dove.

Earl was a graduate of the University of Arkansas, a retired school teacher, and served in the National Guard in the early 1960's. He was a deacon of the First Baptist Church of Highfill where he was a member for 31 years.

Survivors include his wife of 44 years, Mae Lee Dove of the home; one son Dewayne Dove and wife Sarah Bergen Dove of Russellville; one daughter Amber Dove O'Neal and husband Chad of Ruston, Louisiana; his mother Elsie Dove Sherry of Springdale; one brother Gerald L. Dove and wife Marrill of Ozark, Missouri; three grandchildren Keith Dewayne Dove, Camila Ruth O'Neal and Mallory Kate O'Neal; he is also survived by aunts, uncles and numerous nieces and nephews and great nieces and nephews.

Throughout his life he was an example of a good Samaritan to strangers, friends and family. He served as "Papa" to many children, including Carol Grace Riner of Springdale.
