Elton Eugene Webb, 87, died Saturday, June 26, 2010 at Northwest Medical Center in Springdale.

He was born on December 9, 1922 near Blytheville, AR to C.S. and Mary Webb and was the last surviving of five children.

A Southern Baptist minister for more than 50 years, Webb served ten churches in central and northeast Arkansas. He was a World War II veteran serving with the 536th Amphibian Tractor Battalion and their invasions of Okinawa and in the Philippine Islands.

Gene graduated from Lyon College in Batesville and Williams Baptist College in Walnut Ridge. He also attended Southwestern Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, TX.

Upon his retirement he became a full-time grandfather. He was active in First Baptist Church of Springdale, as a member of the Walking Through The Bible Sunday School class and the seniors ministry group.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Cora Elizabeth Webb, in

2007.

Survivors include his wife, Mary Greenlee Webb; one son, Perry Webb and wife Rebecca of Springdale, three grandchildren Amanda Smith and husband Tyler and Sarah Gordley, all of Springdale, Bartley Webb, a graduate student and football coach at Middle Tennessee State University; and one great grandson, Benjamin Robert Smith.

Funeral services will be Monday, June 28, 2010 at 2pm at First Baptist Church in Springdale.. Burial will be in the Bluff Cemetery.

Visitation will be Sunday, June 27, 2010 from 5 to 7pm at Sisco Funeral Chapel in Springdale.
