



Ernestine Carpenter

October 24, 1916 - May 2, 2011

Ernestine (Teena) E. Hooker Carpenter of Fayetteville, AR died May 2, 2011, at the age of 94.

She was born in Seligman, Barry County, Missouri to Ernest and Ruth McClain Hooker.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two sisters; Fern Rubow of Seligman, Mo and

Betty Walker of Springdale; and one brother, Paul Hooker of Rogers.

Teena graduated from Seligman High School in Seligman, Mo and from Draughn's

Business College in Springfield, Mo. She was employed by the Works Progress

Administration (WPA) at Green County Courthouse of Springfield. When the local

office closed, she transferred to the State Office in Kansas City. She served her country

during World War II as Secretary to the Contracting Officer for the Army Air Corps and

Northern American Bomber Plant in Kansas City which made the B-25 Mitchell

bombers.

Teena married James W. Carpenter on December 23, 1943 in Kansas City,

Missouri. Jim

returned from World War II in October of 1945, and in 1948, Teena, Jim and their infant

son, David, moved from Kansas City to Springdale. There they owned and operated

Jim's Radio on Hwy 71 in Springdale which later became Jim's Radio, TV and Communications. Their second son, Ken, was born in Springdale.

Teena attended First United Methodist Church of Springdale where she sang in the choir

for 32 years. She and her husband were avid dancers enjoying ballroom and square

dancing. They were members of the Springdale Shiloh Square Dance Club and Elks

Club. Teena was active in the community in PTA; was a Charter Member of the

Springdale Youth Center Board of Directors; a member of Beta Sigma Phi and past

secretary of Arkansas Television and Electronics Service Association. While working in

Springfield, she sang in the Gospel Quartet on KWTO. She was a well loved member of

the community and will be greatly missed.

She is survived by her husband, Jim, of 67 years; two sons, David J.

Carpenter, his wife

Vonita, and Kendal H. Carpenter, both of Springdale, AR; one granddaughter, Shannon

Carpenter of Springdale; one grandson, Bradley Carpenter of Fayetteville; one brother-in-law,

Bill Walker, of Springdale and one sister-in-law, Kathy Hooker Barnard of Kansas

City, MO.

The family wish to express their gratitude to the staff of Butterfield Trail Village who

have lovingly cared for her since she moved there on September 11, 2001.
