GEORGE EARL PARRISH

George Earl Parrish died Friday, August 22, 2008 after suffering from a fall 4 weeks ago. He was 101 years old. He was born May 26, 1907 in Black Oak, Arkansas to Daniel Chisholmberry Parrish and Mary Reed Parrish. He was a member of Robinson Avenue Church of Christ in Springdale, having served as a deacon and elder. Mr. Parrish married Lorraine Shipp in 1942, she preceded him in death in 2004 after 62 years of marriage.

He was an Army Veteran of WWII., having served as a medic in the 335th infantry. He was awarded 2 Bronze Stars with Oak Leaf Clusters and several other citations for bravery in Germany and Belgium.

He is survived by 4 daughters, Earlene Reeves of Prineville, Oregon, Janice Lucas of Siloam Springs, Arkansas, Susan McLaughlin of Lake Saint Louis, Missouri and Darlene Harvey of Springdale, a foster daughter, Sandra Strode of Springdale, two brothers Oran Parrish of Greenland, Arkansas and Phillip Parrish of Coquille, Oregon, one sister Blanche Allen of Silverton, Oregon, 16 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, August 27, 2008 at Sisco Funeral Chapel of Springdale with Gary Frazier officiating. Burial will be in

Brentwood Cemetery.

Visitation will be Tuesday from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. at the funeral home.
