On Sunday, October 18, 2020, Harold Ray Vowell, devoted husband, father, and papaw passed away at the age of 85. Harold was born August 7, 1935 in Lake City, AR to Clyde and Sylvia Vowell. Harold was married to Betty for 58 years and had 2 children, Kelly Vowell Johnson married to Mitchell Johnson and Andy Vowell married to Lana Vowell all of Springdale.
