Harvey Eugene Smith, Sr., of Fayetteville died peacefully at his home May 11, 2012. He was born April 6, 1923 in Springdale to Benjamin Franklin and Nora Etta Harp Smith.

Harvey lettered in football, basketball and track at Springdale High School and was the captain of his 1940-1941 basketball team. He graduated from the University of Arkansas with a degree in education.

He served in the United States Navy for three years during World War II. He served as a radar operator, and was stationed on Ellice Island, Nanumea in the South Pacific and aboard the USS Auburn (AGC-10). The USS Auburn was involved in the invasion of Iwo Jima and Okinawa.

He married Patricia A. Ware in 1948 in Springdale. They moved to California and spent several years in the nursery and garden supply business in Pacific Palisades before returning to Northwest Arkansas in 1962 where they raised their four children at Springbrook Farm in Fayetteville.

He was preceded in death by his wife Patricia A. Ware Smith in 2003, his parents, Benjamin F. and Nora Etta Smith, two sisters, Ruby Smith and Maxine Smith Hill, two brothers, Vernon Howard Smith and Richard F. Smith.

He is survived by his daughter, Cheryl K. Maples and her husband Richard of

Heber Springs, his daughter, Linda C. Smith of Fayetteville, his son, Harvey E. Smith, Jr. and his wife Amy of Fayetteville, his daughter, Cynthia (Cindy) McAnarney of Fayetteville, numerous grandchildren, great-grandchildren and one great-great grandchild.

Visitation will be Monday, from 5:30 to 7:30 pm at the funeral home.

Funeral services will be Tuesday, May 15, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. at Sisco Funeral Chapel of Springdale with Rev. Nathan Mattox officiating. He will be buried in Bluff Cemetery next to his beloved wife.
