Jorge Erroll Wood, 64, died 1-1-24 at Prairie Grove Health and Rehab in Prairie Grove, Arkansas. Born on January 7, 1959 to Clyde H. and Peggy (Billups) Wood.

He was a member of Central United Methodist Church in Lincoln.

Jorge (pronounced George), graduated co-valedictorian from Lincoln High School in Lincoln, Arkansas in 1976. Following graduation, he attended the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor and the University of Arkansas where he majored in music.

He toured nationally with Broadway musicals and played 3-4 woodwind instruments in the orchestra. He performed at Carnegie Hall, The Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, TN and other venues. On return to Northwest Arkansas he played with the NWA Symphony Orchestra.

Remaining in Lincoln, he volunteered with several charities.

He is predeceased by his brother Chuck Wood (2018).

Survivors include his wife Bonnie (Woolsey) Wood, three stepchildren, Jill Sanchez and her husband Monte, and four grandchildren Anna, Clara, Eva,

and Aaron of Murphy, TX, Sarah and Jesse Simpson of Eagle Rock, MO and Joshua Woolsey of Lincoln. His brother John Wood and his wife June of Lincoln, sister Beth Capehart and husband Art of Fayetteville, GA, and Joyce Wood (Chuck's wife) of Huntstville, and several nieces and nephews.

A service of remembrance will be held on Friday, January 5, 2024 at 11 am at Central United Methodist Church, 101 N. Star Ave., Lincoln, AR.

Interment will be at Lincoln Cemetery at a later date.
