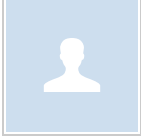


“ Dear Family,

Once Kristi called me on the phone and asked to meet to discuss our senior paper that a group of us were working on together. She was determined to be fair and hear all sides of the situation, before making any decisions. Even back then, she was a rare jewel among sisters. More than a few sorority sisters were psychology majors, but Kristi always set the benchmark for excellence. It was always Zehnder's answers to the essay questions that Dr. Hale and other professors read aloud to the rest of the class. She was very bright and wrote beautifully. She stood apart from the rest of us in this capacity, but she didn't ever want us to think of her differently or smarter than the rest of us. Most of all I'll remember her as fun loving and laughing. Without even talking to her in so many years, I know as a Mother she would have wanted to see her lovely daughters graduate, marry and help them through all the many obstacles that life brings. I know Kristi's faith was strong in college, and from correspondence understand even stronger in her adult years. In the Bible, faith is described as "the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." I truly hope our faith in God, His grace and the love for one another will allow all of us to accept Kristi's purpose here on Earth was completed.
