Lawrence H. Schmieding died Monday, November 16, 2009 at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. He was born October 6, 1920 in Lincoln, Nebraska to August Henry and Martha Beckman Schmieding.

Lawrence owned and operated Schmieding Produce. He was a veteran of World War II serving in the United States Army. He founded the Schmieding Center for Seniors. He was a member of the Springdale Country Club and the Elks Club. He was a Honorary member of the Board of Directors of ILC in New York. He was a member of the Salem Lutheran Church in Springdale. Survivors include his wife Helen Schmieding of the home; one son Rick Sharpe and wife Ellina of Springdale; one daughter Pamela English and husband Marty of Springdale; nine grandchildren and three great grandchildren.
