



## Leon Gaines

June 18, 1923 - October 1, 2011

Leon Newton Gaines of Springdale died October 1, 2011 at Circle of Life, Springdale, Arkansas.

He was born to Taylor Murbeth Gaines and Amanda Eldora Yates Gaines on June 18, 1923 in Coal hill, Arkansas. He was predeceased in death by his parents, by his wife of his first marriage Mildred Struble Gaines and by his sister, Opal Quisenberry and Gladys Swatzel, and a brother, Ralph Gaines.

He is survived by Donna Kaye Cypert Gaines, his wife by his second marriage on June 1, 1984; by a son Jim Edward Gaines of Dallas, Texas and a daughter Toni Gaines Holden and son-in-law Bill Holden of North Fort Myers, Florida; grandchildren Taylor Gaines and Elise Edrington of Little Rock and Cayla-Marie Jackson and Aaron Jackson of Fayetteville. He is also survived by a niece, Judy Richardson of Baytown, Texas and nephews Lloyd Quisenberry of Baytown, Texas and Mike Gaines of Little Rock, Arkansas.

Leon enlisted in the US Army Air Corp at the beginning of WWII and served as a tail gunner on B24's, flying 51 combat missions over enemy territory. He received an honorable discharge with the rank of Staff Sgt. in 1943. He was a member of American Legion Post 1.

Leon then attended the University of Arkansas and graduated with Masters

Degrees in Education and Counseling. He served in administrative positions in Arkansas School Districts of Roger, Springdale and Batesville until his retirement in 1985.

He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Springdale.

Leon was a kind and gentle person who loved his family, friends, and country. He always had a ready smile for any person with whom he had contact.

A graveside memorial service with military honors will be held for family and friends at the National Cemetery, 700 Government Ave., Fayetteville, AR. Service will be held on Tuesday, October 4, 2011 at 2 pm.
