Pastor Robert Lee Jackson, 84, of Springdale, died Tuesday, May 15, 2012 at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. He was born March 4, 1928 Eureka Springs, Arkansas to Jewell and Velva Colvin Jackson.

Robert was President of the Oklahoma District Church Missouri Synod. He was a Lutheran Pastor for many years. He was a member of Salem Lutheran Church in Springdale.
