Robert (Bobby) Teeter, age 83, passed peacefully on Jan 6th, 2025.

Bobby was born October 30, 1941, in Clarksville, AR, to Robert (Bob) and Verneice Teeter.

Growing up in Clarksville, AR, he attended the College of the Ozarks (now University of the Ozarks) and received his doctorate in pharmacy from UAMS in Little Rock, AR.

He was married to Nancy Cochran Shaw (1964-1972) and they shared a daughter, Deanah. He was later married to Gretchen Batie Teeter (1973-2010), and they shared a daughter, Angie.

Bobby practiced pharmacy for 50 years and owned Teeter's Drug from 1977 until his retirement in 2016, at which time he moved closer to his daughters in Rogers, AR.

Bobby absolutely loved being a pharmacist and engaging with his friends and customers in the Clarksville community. Growing up with an aptitude for sports, Bobby was the quarterback for the Clarksville Panthers and played during college as well. Bobby was a professional water-skier with a group that entertained large crowds at Lake Ludwig during the summers. This active

passion transitioned into a love of gym workouts throughout his life.

He enjoyed all types of music and attended multitudes of rock concerts through the 70's and 80's. His last concert was as recent as 2022, seeing ZZ Top (again) at the Walmart AMP. In addition to his pastime of watching westerns and hobby of collecting guns and knives, it wouldn't be a complete description of Bobby without mentioning his love and appreciation of good food. He thoroughly enjoyed special meals with family and friends. Most importantly, he was a sound believer in Jesus Christ. He often mentioned how he was ready for Heaven and posted his favorite bible verses for his Facebook followers.
