### DR. STEVAN MICHAEL VAN ORE

Dr. Stevan Michael Van Ore age 64, of Springdale died August 31, 2008 at his home. He was born October 4, 1943 in Seneca Falls, New York to Lawrence William and Josephine Caparelli Van Ore. He was a United States Navy Veteran serving during Vietnam. He graduated from Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida. He then graduated with his medical degree from the University of Miami. He practiced in Maitland, Florida until 1992. He moved to Cherokee Village, Arkansas in January 1993 and practiced there until 1994. In 1994, he moved to Harrison, Arkansas where he practiced until 2005. He then moved to Springdale, Arkansas and continued his practice there until his death.

He is survived by his wife Mary Ann Banks-Van Ore, whom he married on June 19, 1965. Dr. Van Ore is also survived by the following: One son Stevan Michael Van Ore, Jr. of Fayetteville, Arkansas; two daughters, Lisa Marie Van Ore-Crowe of Maumelle, Arkansas and Anna Theresa Van Ore-Kahn and husband Shaun Jonathan Kahn of Harrison, Arkansas; and one brother, Lawrence Van Ore of Winter Springs, Florida.
