Suzanne “Suzie” Winton DeLozier, 78, of Fayetteville, Arkansas, peacefully passed away at Circle of Life Hospice on September 1, 2021. Suzie, born in Long Beach, California, on June 28, 1943, was the daughter of Suzanna Rose and Edwin Winton. In addition to “tooth-saver,” Suzie was a free spirit, avid gardener, animal and nature lover, crossword puzzle wizard, and extreme-makeover house renovator. She loved her savior Jesus, her family, her friends and her pets.
