



## Teresa Gregoire

October 31, 1958 - October 3, 2024

On Thursday, October 3, 2024, Teresa Gregoire, loving wife and mother of four children, passed away at the age of 65.

She had a passion for sewing and making quilts, many of which she made for friends. She was well known for her quick wit, sense of humor, and for having a very giving and loving spirit. There wasn't much that she wouldn't do for a family member or friend in need.

Teresa was born on October 31, 1958, in Perryton Texas. Her family moved to Northwest Arkansas just before she entered the 8th grade in school. She lived the rest of her life in Arkansas, although she was very proud of her Texas heritage.

She worked off and on in the restaurant business for many years as a cook and sometimes as a server. She also worked for 10 years as a seamstress for an interior decorating business, where she learned many decorating skills, and discovered how much she enjoyed sewing, especially making quilts.

In 1981 she married James Lynch. The marriage produced four children. James passed away in an accident in 1994. Three years later she married her current husband, Thomas Gregoire. They were together for more than 27 years.

She was preceded in death by her mom, Betty Jean Matthews, her dad, Fred Dwaine Forester, and her first husband, James Lynch. She is survived by her husband, Thomas, her four children, Brandon, Travis, Lucas and Hayden, grandchildren Ellie Mae and Lilah, brother, R.D. and Troy, sister Sandra, and several cousins, nieces, and nephews.
