Wilhelmina (Scooter) Dunker Williams, 94 Army nurse veteran
Wilhelmina was born in New York City, New York Feb.4, 1918 and died peacefully on January 20, 2013. She attended Bellview Nursing School and was involved in nursing and helping people her whole life. She worked on the battlefield during World War II and assisted in air surgeries on special aircraft while bringing the wounded to safe ports.

She was a devoted wife to her veteran husband Jack Parker Williams for 64 years until his death in 2007. After 33 moves they retired to Springdale, Arkansas. She attended church at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Springdale. She loved her church and was actively involved in assisting with their programs and members.

Her brother Rudolph Dunker passed away in 1999.
