January 6, 1930 - December 30, 2024

Willis David Duncan went home to be with the Lord on Monday, Dec 30, 2024. He passed away at the age of 94. He was born January 6, 1930 in Warwick, OK to Guy and Rena Duncan.

He was an extremely hard-working man who had an extensive rock collection, and a story behind each rock. He loved the Southwest, apple orchards and desert scenery. He loved to eat copious amounts of cheese and Chinese food from his favorite restaurant Panda Buffett, here in Springdale.
